

The OpenBSD project produces a FREE, multiplatform 4.4BSD-based UNIX-like operating system.




Maintaining packages COMPILE ERROR EVERYWHERE

In real open source, you have the right to control your own destiny.




OPENBSD

- FREE, multi-platform 4.4BSD-based UNIX-like operating system
- amd64, arm64, arm, i386, mipse64 powerpc, powerpc64, riscv64, sparc64
- -release, -stable, -current




OPENBSD - PROJECT GOALS

- "Try to be the #1 most secure operating system."
- Provide the best possible development platform.
- Only use software that is subject to free licenses.
- Standards (ANSI, POSIX, parts of X/Open, etc.)
- Policy-free for this technical decisions.
- Releases at regular intervals ~6 months.



OPENBSD – NICE TO KNOW

- Theo de Raadt Team leader and motivator
- ~80 Developer
- OpenBSD Foundation
- Sub system driven ownership
- Disconnected releases and packages
- No cross-compiling
- Evolution instead of revolution

SHOULD I USE?

PROS

- Packet Filter: super awesome firewall
- Sane defaults : you install, it works, no tweak
- Stability: upgrades go smooth and are easy
- OpenBSD (security) innovations
- Server and desktop ENV
- New and stable packages
- Lot of in-house development

VS

CONS

- Has only FFS file system, which is slow and has no "feature"
- No bluetooth support
- No USB3 full speed performance
- No VM guest additions
- No nvidia support (nvidia's fault)
- No container / docker / jails
- Poor FUSE support (it crashes quite often)

- It's (all) about the money




